


- Mission: provide every healthcare organization in California with the information they need to improve care, enhance health, and lower costs
- Largest nonprofit health information organization in California, serving as an integral part of the state's health data infrastructure, combining and delivering crucial health information for more than 34 million Californians across every county throughout the state.
 - Providing claims, clinical, and lab data for:
 - 13 health plans
 - 125+ hospitals
 - 1800+ providers
 - 1.5M+ admission, discharge, and transfer (ADT) notifications delivered monthly
 - 34M longitudinal patient health records





WHAT ARE ADMISSION, DISCHARGE, TRANSFER (ADT) NOTIFICATIONS?

- Electronic alerts that hospitals must send as a part of CMS Conditions of Participation
- Notify a care team or provider when a patient has been admitted, discharged, or transferred from a hospital to:
 - Streamline care coordination
 - Reduce costly readmissions
 - Reduce repeat tests and procedures
 - Improve quality and outcomes for patients
- > "Small but Mighty" alerts are just 2 to 10 KB per notification!



ACHIEVING A "HEALTHY CALIFORNIA FOR ALL" REQUIRES HEALTH DATA EXCHANGE

DHCS

- California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal (CalAIM) aims to move Medi-Cal towards a population health approach that will better serve CA's most vulnerable populations by:
 - Implementing whole person care approaches and addressing social drivers of health
 - Improving quality outcomes, reducing health disparities, and driving delivery system transformation
 - Creating a user-friendly, efficient, and seamless Medi-Cal system

- Through <u>AB 133</u>, the California Health and Human Services Agency's <u>Data Exchange</u>
 <u>Framework (DxF)</u> is the first ever, statewide data sharing framework that promotes the:
 - Advancement of health equity and expansion of access to whole person care
 - Requires secure and seamless exchange of health information between most health care organizations by 2024
- More than 1,400 organizations have joined the DxF, representing nearly 1,000 entities that signed the <u>Data Sharing Agreement</u> (<u>DSA</u>). View the full list of DSA signatories here!
