


KEY TAKEAWAYS

HOMELESS SERVICES / HOUSING IS A SEPARATE, COMPLEX SYSTEM

- Multiple providers and government entities including Continuums of Care, Housing Authorities, Counties, Cities, and Nonprofits
- Different data sharing and privacy standards (HMIS standards through HUD)
- Historical fear of health care inappropriately "dumping" on homeless services
- Housing is not an entitlement so "referrals" work very differently

NEED TO UNDERSTAND USE CASES BIDIRECTIONALLY

- Health care needs access to housing status information, service providers w/relationships with the patient / member, and interim / permanent housing resources
- Homeless services and housing need
 access to health coverage & provider
 information, access to physical health,
 mental health, and SUD treatment for
 their clients, assistance with resources for
 aging / disabled clients to live
 independently, and funding for more
 housing.
