This vote brings California one step closer to achieving a historic investment in the program.

"This MCO tax, coupled with increased spending to bolster the Medi-Cal program, provides the state with a real opportunity to improve access for Medi-Cal enrollees by supplementing and not supplanting resources for Medi-Cal. The significant investments associated with this year's MCO Tax proposal will provide critical financial support to health care programs that will allow health plans to invest in areas that will drive tangible positive results for Medi-Cal beneficiaries, including primary care, specialty care and graduate medical education.

"Moving forward, the Legislature can play a crucial oversight role in ensuring that both the tax and the investments in Medi-Cal are realized, and helping to protect health care affordability for the millions of Californians we serve."
