## California's Medi-Cal Managed Care Plans Advancing Health Equity





California's Medi-Cal managed care plans are advancing health equity in communities across the state. Enacting change and promoting health equity will improve health care for Californians that need it the most. Some examples include:

## **Empowering Providers** and Patient Education

- Providing focused training for providers to improve knowledge of health equity, and boost cultural competence.
- Implementing value-based contracts to incentivize providers to meet quality standards.
- Working locally to define health equity metrics and track health equity work.
- Partnering with local agencies like health departments and community-based organizations to understand community needs and to address social determinants of health.

## **Tackling Social Barriers to Care**

- Creating Chief Health Equity Officer positions to ensure equity is advanced and a crucial part of all plan operations.
- Allowing trained social workers to analyze and assess patient needs.
- Connecting patients to a strong network of community-based services.
- Implementing alternative payment models and diversifying provider networks to reach more people.
- Collaborating with the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) to ensure a connection between health equity, the CalAIM initiative, provider networks, and other efforts.
- Achieving National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) health equity accreditation, which is focused on improving equity across operations.

## **Data-Driven Equity Analysis**

- Developing reports and visuals to understand how demographics connect to social determinants of health and health outcomes.
- Using this data and analysis to identify communities and populations for outreach.
- Analyzing health data of members to implement strategies that will improve health outcomes for Medi-Cal enrollees.

California's Medi-Cal Managed Care Plans are also committed to working with DHCS to bring the multi-year CalAIM initiative to fruition with the following new services:

**Enhanced Care Management (ECM):** this new benefit provides services to those with the most complex medical and social needs. These members receive help in coordinating physical, behavioral, developmental, and social services.

**Community Supports:** 14 services provided by Medi-Cal managed care plans to help members address social needs such as safe housing and healthy meals.

DHCS and Medi-Cal managed care plans will be working together to expand these services even more in 2024 and beyond.
